## *Reflections from the Rev.*

The opening section of Hebrews 13 has a heading that reads, "Service Well-Pleasing to God". The things being asked here are not easy. For example, vs 3 talks about remembering people in prison. This in itself would be easy if it wasn't for the last part of this verse. The author of Hebrews (not Paul) has the audacity to challenge his readers to remember these prisoners, AS IF THEY THEMSELVES were in prison. As if THEY THEMSELVES were being tortured. This is an ask, not merely for simple sympathy. This is an ask for deep, gut-wrenching empathy. What a challenge. Who could possibly meet this?

It's also fun to note that in verse 6 you will find a quote from none other than Psalm 118. Remember our Palm Sunday text? The verse quoted is one that gives me a lot of encouragement. Coincidentally verse 6 of Hebrews 13 quotes verse 6 of Psalm 118. "The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can anyone do to me?"

In Hebrews 13 there are a couple of other verses that caught my attention. They are the first 2 verses of this chapter. "Let mutual affection continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it." This led me to thinking about angelic encounters. The bible definitely talks about such encounters. As a child I am convinced that I had an angelic encounter.

The angelic encounter. This occurred when I was still in elementary school. Our family would occasionally go camping at a small campground called Buffalo Creek Park. At that time it had only about 20 camping sites. I loved the playground and I especially loved the creek that ran through the park. It was small, but big enough and watery enough to cool off and swim a little. Learning to swim for me came a little later than other kids. But once I got brave enough to swim, I think you would call me a fish. I loved the water.

On one camping trip I got to take a school friend with me. Elle and I were really good friends. I was so happy to get to have her join us. On Saturday we went over to the creek. She told me she could swim and of course I believed her. We started floating with the current of the creek. The current pulled us gently until we found ourselves in a deep hole. This is when I learned that Elle had oversold her ability to swim. She started going under and then she panicked. I panicked too and swam out to help her. This is when I learned that this is a no-no when trying to save someone who is drowning.

Yep, she got her arm around my neck and was trying to keep herself afloat on me. This meant I was being pushed under the water. She was smaller than me, so for a time I was able to keep her afloat. But after a time I started getting tired. It was getting harder and harder to get to the surface for a breath. I came to the frightful conclusion that I might actually drown.

Just as I was getting to the point where I thought I couldn't break the surface anymore, a hand grabbed me. This guy had come along and saw our predicament. I have some memories of what he looked like. He reminded me of "Meathead" from All in the Family. None the less, this guy got into the water and pulled me and my friend Elle to safety. What a relief! I looked around so I could thank the guy who saved us. He was nowhere to be found. Elle and I went back to our camper and we told them what had happened. There was a great deal of relief and I think I remember ice cream being part of the consolation.

Once Elle and I recovered and got our emotions under control, I remembered the guy who helped us. I had to go find him and thank him. I went from camp site to camp site. I could not find him anywhere. Was I not going to be able to thank him? As I thought over those moments of drowning and then feeling his presence I began to wonder if this was a supernatural presence I experienced. Was it an angel?

To this day, I believe strongly in the possibility that this was indeed an angel that saved me. But why come in the form of someone who looked like Michael "Meathead" Stivic (Rob Reiner)? God and I have been discussing it ever since. If I ever need an angelic intervention, I have a few suggestions for what this angel should look like. (Eric Northman please!)

So remember, whether looking like Meathead or a super model, you never know how your angel unaware will show up.





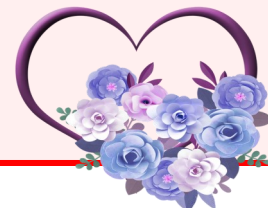
