Just a few weeks ago, our Lay Leader (Dave Kopecky) and I were privileged to be able to attend our first in person Annual Conference session in 2 years. Dave did an excellent job at talking through some of the high points of our conversations at Annual Conference.

There is one item we discussed that I would like to elaborate a bit more on, as it will directly effect us here at St John's. That item is the election of a new Bishop for the Desert Southwest Annual Conference. For the past year we have been blessed that Bishop Grant Hagiya has stepped in to serve as the Bishop of both the Cal-Pac conference and the Desert Southwest Conference. But, Bishop Hagiya and several other bishops from the Western Jurisdiction have discerned that it is time for them to retire, and give the opportunity for new Episcopal leaders to be elected.

This will happen November 2-5, 2022. One of the interesting things about the Episcopal elections this year is that the method being used to discern candidates for the Episcopacy will be different than ever before. The aim in changing the method of receiving candidates for the office of Bishop is to create more space for the Holy Spirit to guide delegates to Jurisdictional Conference in deciding who is called to the Episcopacy. Previously, the process of receiving and voting on candidates was a very political process. It was very much a matter of whoever could sway the most people to vote for them would be elected. The new process will eliminate much of the politics from the process, and help ensure that the candidates voted into Episcopal office are the best candidates for the job, called by God to serve as Bishop.

As preparations for Jurisdictional Conference are made, I simply ask that we all be in prayer for everyone involved in the Episcopal Elections, and that just the right person will be elected to serve as our resident Bishop in the Desert Southwest Conference, effective January 1, 2023.

A Message from Our Lay Leader Points to Ponder

Genesis 2:7 Then the LORD God formed a man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being.

In the first few chapters of Genesis there is a lot about how God created all things, but the creation of a human was different. Here we hear that the human (man or *adam* in Hebrew) became alive when God breathed life into him. The breath of God, a special connection, linking us all to our Creator in a special way.

Just breathe. It's something we all do between 12 and 20 times every minute, awake or asleep. That translates to about 900 breaths every hour, 21,600 times a day, 7,880,000 times a year. If you are fortunate enough to live to 80 years, we can (or will be able) to say that we have taken over 630 million breaths! Wow! That takes my breath away just thinking about it! We can go without most things for a while, even important things like sleeping, eating and drinking, but we need to breathe many times every minute. Yet I would guess that most of us take breathing for granted, that is until something comes along, like an illness, that we can't do it so well. Every breath, a gift from God. Many of you may remember from long ago classes in science that when we breathe in, our lungs capture and use the oxygen from the air, and we breathe out (expel) carbon dioxide. Why do we take 12 to 20 breaths a minute? Because that is the rate we need to expel the carbon dioxide from our system. It all works on automatic pilot; our breathing adjusts up and down as we need to expel more

By now I can hear you saying, "OK Dave, we get it. Breathing is important. Breathing is necessary, breathing is even sacred. Where is this going?" Well, I am going to tell you. Are you ready? Take a deep breath and continue!

or less carbon dioxide, depending on the work our bodies are doing. This explains why we breathe

If breathing is a sacred gift from God, the most important gift, why do we (myself included) squander so much of it on talk and activities that go against God? Gossip, hateful and deceitful words, cursing God and God's creation; it seems that too often we are caught up and locked in on words and deeds that forget, neglect, or go against everything our Creator created us for. It's a conscious choice that we each make every day. How can we change our words and actions? How about we change our focus?

Back in 1878, Edwin Hatch put these words to music:

less frequently when we are asleep!

"Breathe on me, Breath of God; fill me with life anew, that I may love the way you love, and do what you would do. Breathe on me, breath of God; until my heart is pure, until my will is one with yours, to do and to endure."

What a beautiful prayer! May it be yours and mine today and always. Blessings,



A Message from Our Finance Director

Hello brothers and sisters in Christ,

I hope this summer is off to a good start for you all. I wanted to give you a quick update as to where the church stands with giving and expenses.

Giving for the first two weeks of June is \$22,160.87 compared to last year the same time of \$14,047.43. Our expenses this month for the first two weeks is \$15,970.00 showing a loss of \$9,778.47 compared to last year's expenses of \$11,698.76. Last year this time we were in the positive of \$2,349.07.

Giving for the year through June 18th is \$114,913.38 and this time last year was \$104,294.87. At first glance this looks like movement in the right direction, and it is, however our expenses this year are higher than last year. Our expensive so far this year are \$152,116.71 compared to last years \$125,285. As you can see, we are operating at a negative balance of \$37,203.33. Last year we were operating at a negative balance of \$20,991.55. By the end of the month, we will have hit about 45% of our budget for the year.

I just want to remind you that with summer we always see a drop in giving because attendance is usually down, but the church doesn't stop functioning and bills don't stop coming. To make it easy to continue to be faithful in your giving you can sign up for automatic giving through St John's website.




