Pastor's Corner

Holy Week and Easter will be upon us this month. I've always treasured these observances. We start on Good Friday with the brutal crucifixion of Jesus and end on Sunday with the bright and joyous celebration of Easter.

Good Friday is the day that we remember as the day that a man named Jesus was sentenced to death by religious leaders and crucified by Romans. When you think about the fact that Jesus, the Messiah, the Savior was crucified, do you wonder why we call this day Good Friday? Most believe that this was simply a term that could be interchanged with words like pious and holy.

Good Friday is indeed a holy day for us as followers of Christ. It is intentionally a dark service. You are supposed to feel the pain, the grief, and the emptiness that was a part of what Jesus experienced on the Road to Resurrection. And it wasn't just Jesus that experienced grief and emptiness, it was his followers. No matter how many times Jesus had tried to explain to them what was going to happen, it was futile in sparing the disciples grief, emptiness, doubt, and fear. No definition of a 180 degree turn around could be exemplified more, when you look at the joyous celebration of Jesus' triumphant journey into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. In a matter of days Jesus would experience a devastating trial, beatings, and execution. How could anyone consider this a good day?

Thankfully from where you and I sit, we know where the story goes from here. The story of Good Friday is a key part of the Good News. It is part of our rescue story. But it's only part of the story. Jesus told His disciples what would happen. He would be resurrected. In this resurrection a new covenant would be established. It was a covenant that could be kept, because the terms became so very simple. Believe on the Lord Jesus and you shall be saved.

All the gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John tell a resurrection story. I think Mark's version is the most interesting because many would think it's the least satisfying. Women go to the tomb to embalm Jesus. Their worries about who would roll away the stone disappeared quickly when they find the tomb already open. A young man in a white robe tells them that Jesus was raised. The man tells the women to go and tell the disciples to meet Jesus in Galilee. And what do the women do? They leave the tomb, running as fast as they can and they TELL NO ONE! That's it! That's how Mark ends. Yet here we are today, over 2000 years later with the full story firmly in our hands. Clearly at some point these women told someone so why did Mark end it this way? I believe it was intentional. Mark wants his readers to write the rest of the story. All that Jesus said and did should give us the tools we need to do that. When Mark wrote this, there were a lot of reasons to be fearful. Christians were being persecuted and executed in Rome thanks to the madness of Nero. What are our reasons today to be fearful? Maybe this is the season to overcome any fear we might have, get out there, and tell the story of Jesus sacrificial love for us.

A Message from Our Finance Team

Hello Fellow Brothers and Sister's in Christ

Here is the monthly financial report for the month of February.

General fund giving for the month of February was \$10,230.82.

Miscellaneous income for the month was \$10,467.43. Total income for February was 20,698.25. Our expenses for the month of February were \$29,762.20, giving us a negative net income of **\$-9,063.95**. February of last year, our giving was slightly higher, but our spending was also higher, and our negative net income was **-\$15,217.18**.

Our general fund income for the year so far is \$21,605.13 and other income is \$14,019.97, giving us a total revenue of \$35,625.10. Our profit and loss report shows that we have a negative net income of **\$-17,405.33** for the year.

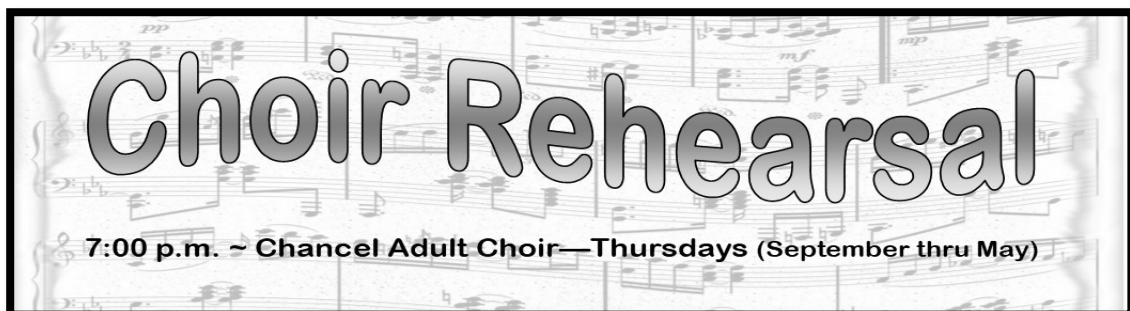
Last year, this time for the first two months of the year we were at a total income of \$33,815.39 and our profit and loss statement showed a negative net income of **- \$14,830.53**. So, although our total income was slightly higher this year than last, so was our spending.

Medicare Negotiations:

For those of you unaware, Medicare is now negotiating prices with the drug companies, and this year they are focusing on the following medications: Ozempic, rybelsus, Wegovy, Xtandi, Pomalyst, Ibrance, Ofev, Linzess, Calquence, Austedo, Austedo XR, Breo Ellipta, Tradjenta, Xifaxan, Vraylar, Janumet, Janumet XR, and Otezla. Manufacturers will have to meet the negotiated prices on these medications by 2027.

Avoiding Scams

There is a good article in the March/April AARP Bulletin about how to stay safe and fight back against the latest scams. I highly recommend reading it. In general, AARP has lot of pertinent articles for everyone, and membership is only about \$12/year. Give it a look! Artificial intelligence (AI) is the latest tool being used by sneaky scammers to cheat you out of your hard-earned money. For example, organizations will not message you personally about problems with your computer.

Vitamins and Supplement Warning

Regarding vitamins and supplements: Be aware that there are no regulations for these; there's no guarantee that what the label says is in the capsule and what is actually in the capsule are the same! Very few actually undergo research to support what a particular supplement is supposed to do. Always look at the labels for independent lab testing. According to Consumer Reports, check for seals from the U. S. Pharmacopeia (USP), NSF International, UL Solutions, and Consumer Lab. These organizations ensure the product contains the ingredients and doses listed on the label and is free from harmful contaminants. For more details can visit Consumer Reports to find articles on these "natural" cures and supplements. Caution, there may be a charge to see these articles. Consumer Reports is a trustworthy source because they purchase test items using their own money. They do not accept advertising dollars or free products from manufacturers.

Over-the-counter (OTC) medicines and supplements.

Always be sure to let your provider know what you are taking, even if it is an over-the-counter medication or supplement. There can be dangerous interactions between your prescription medications and over-the-counter supplements and medications. For example, if you have an autoimmune disorder, Turmeric supplements can make your autoimmune condition worse!

Dear United Methodists in the Desert Southwest,

Greetings in the name of the One who heals and makes whole!

I hereby call the regular session of the Desert Southwest Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church to meet **on June 12-15, 2025**, at the Rio Hotel in Las Vegas, NV. We will be hosted by the North District and we look forward to learning more about our siblings and their ministries.

Our theme this year is “And Let It Begin With Me,” based on Jeremiah 17:14 and Psalm 51:10. As we live into our vision of “A Healthy Church for A Healthy World,” we must recognize that the work towards healing and wholeness starts on a personal level with each one of us. Healthy disciples make healthy churches. Healthy churches will work towards healthy communities. Healthy communities will create a healthy world. I invite you to reflect on our theme and these two passages as we prepare for our time together.

Your attendance is always essential for building our covenant community, and even more so this year, because we will be voting on the [ratification of four Constitutional Amendments](#), which the 2020/24 General Conference acted on. Each vote is crucial, and I trust you will take that responsibility seriously and make plans to attend.

As we gather, I acknowledge that there is unease about meeting in a place where gambling is the main driver of the economy. And yet, it is part of our mission field. As we wrestle with this conundrum, I invite us to affirm the UMC stance of “reject(ing) the practice of gambling because it focuses society’s attention on the acquisition of monetary goods at the exclusion of all else and enriches a small minority at the expense of the larger majority” (*2024 UMC Social Principles: The Social Community- E. Gambling*) while also reflecting on our mission “to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world” even and especially in places like Las Vegas.

Information is now available at dscumc.org/annual-conference/. Please pay attention to the due dates for registration and other submissions, and I ask you to please abide by these deadlines. Doing so will greatly help the continuing planning of the conference. It will avoid causing undue stress on our staff and volunteers. I trust you will do your part as beloved members of our covenant community.

I look forward to being with all of you in Las Vegas in June! May the Holy Spirit move in our minds and our hearts, even now, as we prepare for this important work of holy conferencing.

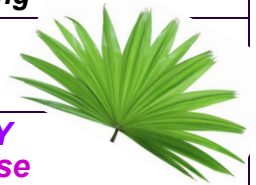
