The fruit of the Spirit passage in <u>Galatians 5:22-23</u> gives me tremendous hope for my own life. Scripture says, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law." When I read that list it's like I can see the person I long to be. I long to be a person full of love, joy, and peace. I long to have patience, kindness, and goodness. I long to be marked by faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Who wouldn't? I see within those incredible characteristics the marks of a fully abundant life. I see Jesus.

At the same time, I see myself in light of these incredible fruits of the Spirit. I see all the ways in which my life doesn't line up with what the Holy Spirit desires to birth in me. How can we, in all our sin and brokenness, live a life marked by these characteristics? How can we be a people so full of the Spirit that our very being portrays the Spirit of God who dwells within us?

God longs to tell you and me today that by grace alone, a life marked by the fruit of the Spirit is entirely possible—but only by grace. In and of myself, I can produce none of these wonderful characteristics. In my own strength, I will only produce selfishness, laziness, and pride. "But with God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26). The Bible calls these characteristics fruit for a reason. They are birthed out of the glorious working of God in us. They come entirely by God's grace.

So how do we allow the Holy Spirit to work at the core of our being and produce these wonderful fruits? How do we become children of God marked by the working of the Spirit in our lives? It comes from being connected to our source, that the Spirit might plant seeds that grow within us. As we spend time with God we live more fully into the Imago Dei, the image of God in us. In God's presence our heart transforms into a greater reflection of the Lord's glorious love. God can do incredible and miraculous things in us if we simply open our hearts and spend time abiding in the Lord. The more time we spend receiving God's love for us, the more areas of brokenness and sin become healed and transformed. If you want to bear the fruit of the Spirit—if you want to be a person marked by the working of God at your core—then you must spend time each day simply being loved by God.

There is no shortcut to holiness. There is no trick to godliness. Jesus has made a way for us to enter into the holy places and see the face of God. God will do magnificent things in you today if you will follow the path laid before you by Jesus and spend time resting in the presence of your Lord and Savior. Receive God's love. Allow the words God speaks over you to transform the way you view yourself and the world around you. Spend time in prayer meditating on God's word and allowing your heart to become more like Jesus' today.

A Message from Our Lay Leader Points to Ponder

As we move from Spring into Summer, I can't help but think of God's perfect timing as seen through nature and the changing of the seasons. Ecclesiastes 3:1 reminds us "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens..." When we look at the changing of seasons, we see another example of God's perfect timing. We are so used to the regularity of the hours, the days, sunrise followed by sunset, that we often forget about the power and majesty of the Creator who put all of this in motion and continues to keep every star and planet on their course. The spinning of the Earth on its axis and the tilting of the Earth at just the right angle so that the seasons change is a testament that our Creator is in control.

To some, this view of God might seem distant and overwhelming. After all, in the vastness of the Universe and the immensity of God, how can humanity, especially one individual, count for anything? The writer of Ecclesiastes struggled with this idea too. He wrote, "He has made everything beautiful in its time. He has also set eternity in the human heart; yet no one can fathom what God has done from beginning to end." (Ecclesiastes 3:11)

Jesus took on this idea during his time here on Earth. "God incarnate;" literally God in the Flesh. Even before his death and resurrection, Jesus was reminding the people about God's love for each of us. One of my mom's favorite hymns was "His Eye is on the Sparrow." The chorus goes, "I sing because I'm happy. I sing because I'm free. His eye is on the sparrow, and I know he watches me." This beautiful idea is taken from Scripture in the book of Matthew. There, Jesus is talking to his disciples whom he is sending out to preach and heal in his name. They obviously are overwhelmed by these responsibilities, so Jesus gives them all a pep talk. He says, "Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground outside your Father's care. And even the very hairs of your head are all numbered. So, don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows." (Matthew 10:29-31)

In an article I recently read, the author summed this all up perfectly. "If God can take care of the birds, the flowers of the fields, and the winds, so can God take care of us. Your dream may not be visible, or your heart may be aching from a loss. Remember that the same God that ordains the sun to rise and set is the same God that has your heart in the palm of His hands. In God's timing, all is made right whether here on earth or in glory."

Greetings Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This month I am not going to bore you with numbers, instead I asked Karen Zeyouma if she would give her testimony about her experience with tithing. She and I have had many conversations about tithing over the past year, as she was trying to work up to tithing levels and I have been tithing for the past many years. Here is her testimony:

During the past six months, I have faced many trials and obstacles that I never imagined I would in my life. My faith has been tested time and time again and many areas of my life have felt unstable. I have spent many sleepless nights awake worrying about the many trials and obstacles that I have been experiencing. When I find myself wide awake at night I pray and talk to my Abba father. I have had a few conversations during the middle of the night about my financial situation. I tell my Abba and my Jesus how I am feeling and what I am thinking (even though he already knows before I speak it). It is comforting to know there is more than what I can see in this world and that my Lord is ALWAYS with me, holding me by the right hand.

After many conversations with Tracy, I decided that I was going to start tithing at the beginning of 2022, even though I was feeling like I had a lack of finances and a lack of security. It was a scary decision, but I knew that I could trust Jesus to provide. After starting my tithe, more than once or twice in the last few months, I have wondered if I would be able to make my bills and there have been few times that my checks did not cover my bills. This is not something that I have experienced much over the years since I began my practice as a Speech Pathologist but has become more the norm lately for me. However, despite it all, I continued to faithfully give my 10%. I will admit, I was nervous about it at times, but when writing out my check I would smile and say to myself "OK Father, I know that you will provide, if I am giving my first fruits to you!" And he did! In fact, once when I was skeptical about writing my check of tithing and almost talked myself out of it, a long-awaited check for a retroactive raise came and covered all that I needed, and I was able to 'pay ahead' on some things. Another week that I almost chose not to tithe, but did, I received a check that was over and above what I expected! Tithing has increased my faith in Jesus, and it is comforting to know that his plans for me are better and bigger than what I can imagine and he will guide me, protect me and provide for me along the way, as long as I am faithful in following him. And because I have been faithful, so has He.

I pray for all of you, my sisters and brothers, that you will be strong in the faith and follow the will of God.






