Pastor's Corner

The calendar makes it clear. We are in the year 2024. And yet we are holding the 2020 General Conference from April 23 – May 3, 2024. What gives? To make it more confusing, let me share word for word the General Conference delegate report from last year's annual conference:

DSC Delegation Report 2023

Dan: Bishop Carlo, members of the annual conference and friends, I am here representing the 2024 delegation to General Conference

Paul: (interrupting) Excuse me, Dan we are the 2020 delegation.

Dan: But we are scheduled to go to the 2024 General Conference.

Paul: It is actually the 2020 General Conference it just happening in 2024,

Dan: The 2020 General Conference in Minneapolis? Paul: No, the 2020 General Conference will be held in Charlotte North Carolina.

Dan: So, we are going to North Carolina in 2020?

Paul: No, we are going in 2024.

Dan: For General Conference 2024?

Paul: No for General Conference 2020 just being held in 2024.

Dan: Wait a second, we went to Salt Lake City for Jurisdictional conference in November of 2022?

Paul: That's right.

Dan: And we elected 3 bishops?

Paul: Yes.

Dan: Jurisdictional conference happens after the General Conference.

Paul: Except for the jurisdictional conference 2022 which happened before General Conference 2020 which will be held in 2024.

Dan: Will there be a Jurisdictional conference in 2024? Paul: Yes, it is scheduled to happen after the General Conference 2020. Dan: In 2024.

Paul: Naturally

Dan: Let me get this straight 2024 is a General Conference year? Paul: Yes. Dan: And we are having a General Conference? Paul: Yes. Dan: General Conference edits the Book of Discipline Paul: That's right. Dan: When we are done with that in 2024 and the Publishing Company prints the book what date will be on the cover? Paul: Presumably 2020. Dan: Will there be a General Conference 2024? Paul: That is scheduled for 2026. Dan: Will there be jurisdictional conference in 2026? Paul: No one has said either way. Dan: When will General Conference 2028 happen? Paul: In 2028 of course. Dan: So, we had jurisdictional conference in 2022 which shall be forever known as 2022 even though it happened before General Conference 2020 which is scheduled for 2024 to be followed by Jurisdictional conference 2024. Then in 2026 they have scheduled General Conference 2024 which may or may not be followed by Jurisdictional conference 2026. Then in 2028 General and jurisdictional conferences will happen in the usual way. Paul: it is just that simple. Dan: Thank you for explaining it so clearly.

Now that you have the clear picture of how we will proceed with General Conferences over the next few years, I want to take some time to talk about what will take place there. Apologies in advance if this is a snooze fest.

The theme for this General Conference is "...and know that I am God." This is taken from Psalm 46:10. This event will bring together 862 delegates from 13 different jurisdictions and 139 Annual Conferences. Here's what the ethnic make-up of our delegates looks like:

US – 55.9% Africa – 32% Philippines – 6% Europe – 4.6% Others – 1.5% The total number of churches and church members determines the number of delegates an annual conference may send. The delegates of a conference are evenly divided between clergy and lay people. From our Desert Southwest Conference, we will send 2 delegates. Rev. Dan Hurlbert of Prescott United Methodist Church is our clergy delegate and Paul Gomez is our lay delegate. Although Bishops will be in attendance, none of them are able to vote.

The format of this General Conference will look a lot like our own Annual Conference. Worship services, memorials, breakout sessions, committee reports, meals, and (the part you've been wondering about) legislation.

It is no secret that one of the hottest topics to be discussed is around the inclusion of our LGBTQ siblings. Allowing United Methodist churches and clergy to preside over same-sex marriages and considering our LGBTQ siblings worthy of exploring a call to ministry will be, without a doubt, the weightiest topics covered. But these aren't the only topics to be discussed. I am going to simply list the topics today. Over the next few weeks, I will explore in depth each of them.

Revised Social Principles Ecumenical Relationships Clergy Focus Responses to Sexual Misconduct Students and Special Sundays Treatment of Girls and Women Young People's Ministries Older Adult Concerns Wespath (Clergy Benefits)

This is an invitation for you as part of the connection with all other United Methodist siblings to participate as much as possible in the events of our General Conference. All sessions will be available online. Here is the main website to access all General Conference resources:

Conferencing is an historic part of being a Methodist. In the United States we've been observing General Conferences since Christmas of 1784. It is by these conferences that we ensure that our Book of Discipline continues to represent the Wesleyan Quadrilateral of Scripture, Tradition, Reason, and Experience. Let us be in prayer for all of our delegates as they faithfully commit to this important work.

He is not here; for He is risen, as He said. Matthew 28:6

The season of Lent, Holy Week, and Easter have ended. For some, this time was one of intense introspection and outward spiritual growth. For others, it was a time to re-connect with our beliefs and our friends and family. I'm sure that for some, it was more of a time to plan. What's ahead?

Whether the last few months resonated with your journey of faith or whether it was more about getting meals planned and new outfits set out, the story of Jesus' death and resurrection has been at the forefront of Christian theology for the last two thousand years. Even from the beginning, there were groups, loosely called the Gnostics, who taught that it didn't matter if Jesus had actually risen from the dead. To them, it was more important to follow the teachings of Jesus for the lessons in morality and how to live a life pleasing to God. These teachings were officially "purged" by church leaders in the 2nd and 3rd century, but the ideas lingered on, even today.

It's easy to see the draw of this idea. We can all understand the sacrifice of Jesus. The idea that Jesus suffered and died for us is painful, but relatable. Who among us does not have at least one person whom we love so much that we would gladly die for, if it meant giving them life? The resurrection is tougher. I think it is safe to say that none of us have known anyone, or heard of anyone, who has been declared dead for three days, and then came back to life.

In 1932, Presbyterian minister Alfred Ackley was preparing to head to church for Easter services. As he dressed, he listened to a radio preacher who declared that it didn't matter if Jesus had actually risen from the dead, that his truths and message still lived on. This statement made Ackley so angry that he almost threw the radio across the room. He went to church and preached an impassioned message about the importance of the Resurrection. Still, he couldn't shake his anger. His wife suggested that he put his thoughts into a song, and to put his ideas into a positive way, not dwelling on the negative feelings. Almost immediately, Ackley began to write the words to one of our most loved Easter hymns, He Lives. "I serve a risen savior, He's in the world today. I know that He is living, whatever men may say." And the chorus, which ends with, "You ask me how I know He lives? He lives within my heart!"

Friends, the Resurrection does matter. Jesus was not only paid the debt for our sins on the cross, but his resurrection showed his victory over sin and over death. It gives us the assurance that we too will live again after this time on Earth has ended. There is a reason why Protestant churches do not show Christ on the cross. It's an emphasis on the fact that the cross was not the end of things, but the beginning of new things. It's an anchor that should give us all strength, courage, and hope as we live out lives and as we serve God in this turbulent and challenging world.

A Message from Our Finance Director

Hello Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Just wanted to give you a quick update on our year to date and monthly income to expenses. Giving for the month of March through the 19th is \$8,459.22 and other income is \$209, totaling \$8,668.22. Our expenses for the month so far are \$16,955.51, giving us a negative net income of -\$8,287.29. As a reminder, our weekly budgetary needs are \$6956.25. Our weekly spending so far this month is slightly below our budget at \$5651.83, which is a positive, but our giving still needs to increase to meet our budgetary needs.

Giving for the year to date through March 19 is \$36,863.06 and other income is \$5620.55, totaling \$42,483.61. Our expenses through March 19th are \$65,505.81, giving us a negative net income of -\$23,022.20 for the year so far.

We ended up with a negative net income of -\$15,121.56 for the month of February. Total income for the month of February was \$11,596.74 and expenses were -\$26,718.30.






