
Advent Lunches

I also had the audacity to have us sing Christmas songs.

Thursday- More work on the grant and worked to get Bob installed immediately as trustee (before Jan 1) and have him designated as VP. We did a very thorough walk through and now we're just waiting on the bid. As the dust settled, I dove in to work on the message for Sunday. I love Mary's story!
