Monday – Armed with caffeine and sheer will, I arrived at church at 8:00 am. Today was the start of our 2026 Vacation Bible School. The kids were set to arrive at 9:00 am. The first problem was I couldn't find the scripts that Heidi had so painstakingly printed out for me. (Guess what I found today?) Heidi was kind enough to reprint them. We gathered for prayer at 8:30. The kids started filing in. Some were familiar from the last 2 years, except they've GROWN! We had several new faces too. One of them came with his adorable pre-mee baby sister. Take a number to hold that sweet little girl! We only started about 5 minutes late, which is really good for the first day of VBS. AD Heidi and Ollie hammed it up as they led the "challengers" through all of the songs and introduced the story and theme of the day. Today was the story of Esther and how to be brave even when you're afraid. Our Mountain Motto was "I can do all things through him who strengthens me." Philippians 4:13. We would say this every day in multiple ways with the kids. There was also a lift lesson each day. Today's was "I can be brave". The kids went through all of their activities. In science one experiment didn't work so they moved on to the next one which involved...lard. (Gulp) The kids put lard on one hand and nothing on the other and then stuck their hands in cold water. The lard hand didn't feel cold. However...this also led to one of those VBS things. Suddenly saying "The Lard be with you" was a trigger for laughter. Would I dare use this on Sunday? Ollie got really comfortable on the puppet stage. So comfortable that in the last song his dancing collapsed the entire puppet stage. Ollie was exposed. What to do? Roll with it. Ollie went down and hung out with all of the kids. He kind of would become a celebrity by the end of the week. Once the kids were gone, we took some time to set for the next day. Then it was time for me to head home to grab a bit of my weekend.



Tuesday – Once again armed with caffeine and sheer will, I arrived at church at 8:00 am. Ms. Chris was warning us about the 2nd day chaos that usually happened with VBS. I hope she’s wrong. No puppet stage catastrophes today. Today’s theme was giving it our all. The Bible story of the day was the Widows Mite. The lift lesson for the day was “I can give it my all”. Another round of fun activities. Its so impressive to see how the station leaders provide such awesome experiences for each group each day. The crafts with Vicki Baker were great, the snacks with Rex Layfield, Melissa Dahmer, and Trudy Mixon were awesome, music with Andrea Penn was a hoot, (and she’s a hero because the AC wasn’t working in the music room, it had a sauna vibe going) Story time with Lois, aka Mom brought fun treats each day and good lessons, Scott Larson brought a lot of energy and good conversations with recreation. He’s so good at tying the lessons to the games. Russell Cox led the science station, which is always a kid favorite. Suzanne and Robin kept our cute preschoolers, the Snow Bunnies, busy in their room. At the opening assembly Ollie mentions “Seal-ia” in the script. This would turn into an ongoing saga with the kids and no Heidi and Rev Amy did not perpetuate it. We decided after yesterdays stage debacle we’d just have Ollie come down and hang with the kids during the last song. This led to a whole lot of questions like why is your belly so big (fish), why do you have a whole in the back of you (for when mother nature called), and last but not least, who was Seal-ia. Ollie started telling the kids that he likes Seal-ia and thought she was cute. Then he would ask, “Should I tell her?” The overwhelming response. Yes! This would lead us to day 3. For now it was time to go home and grab a little more weekend time.

Wednesday – Another day, another 8:00 am arrival time. I got there even before the men's bible study started gathering. Today's theme was about prayer. The Bible Story was Jesus praying in the Garden of Gethsemane. The lift lesson of the day was, "I can pray". We got through the opening session. I was silly enough to think I could get actual work done during VBS. I managed to get a bit done with closing out the 2026 security grant. I talked about station leaders for Tuesday. Let's talk about our group leaders. We had 4 groups and here are their leaders. We had the Kindergarten, the Cozy Cubs. This rambunctious group of 9 was led by Meg and Glynn Baker. Next we had our 1st/2nd Grade group, the Penguin Pals led by Cindy Anderson. We also had a 3rd Grade group, the Frosty Friends led by Ms. Chris, and finally we had the 4th and 5th grade group, the Arctic Adventurers led by Keri Balk. The Seal-ia saga continued in the final assembly. "Seal-ia" sent Ollie her picture. This was displayed on the puppet stage and in the slides for the assembly. During the last song, Ollie danced with the kids again. This time he had a "Fish Cake Pop" from Sea-bucks. After this I went back and starting putting together the orders of worship for the last Sunday in June. It's earlier than usual, but I won't be in the office next week when I would get them ready. Some of you may have heard whispers about "Toilet paper Wars". This was something that happened a couple of years ago when some of us went to the Leadership Institute in Kansas City. This was a war that took place between Rex and I. Let's just say it ramped up again. I didn't start it. But I did come in to find my coffee cup stuffed with toilet paper. This could not go unanswered. So Heidi and I engaged in a "team building project". We took 12 toilet paper rolls and wrote the names of the disciples on them. They received a toilet paper head and a toilet paper head cover. Then "Jesus" was placed on a cup so he could deliver the Sermon on the Mount. This diorama we placed in the refrigerator where Rex would be getting out the snacks for the next day. Teeheeheehee. Although I was exhausted from VBS, it was strange not to have Bible Study that night. But we actually cooked something for dinner, which was nice.

Thursday – Last day of 8:00 am arrivals. Whew! Heidi and I were hanging around the fellowship hall. We wanted to catch the moment Rex opened the refrigerator. Eventually we had to get ready for opening assembly. But we caught the moment, finally when he opened the refrigerator. He looked straight at our diorama. No reaction. NO REACTION? What kind of game was this. Heidi and I waited and waited. Nothing. How long was Rex going to keep this up? We had other things to worry about. The theme for the day was hope. The story was from Acts and told about Peter and John healing the lame man in the temple. The lift lesson was “I can hope!” I helped with the first Recreation period of the day. It was a sort of “shell game” where you hid medals in bowls and switched them around. Then the kids had to guess which bowl had the medal. Immediately seeing that each bowl was different,

I realized it would take no time for them to figure out what each bowl had or didn't have. So we made them turn around. We meaning Cody Balk and I. Cody came in to help me with recreation, since we all know that Rev Amy can't really run like little kids anymore. Anyway, this was a fun activity and even better because the kids thought so too. Scott made it in from his dentist appointment at the end of the first session. I handed rec off to him. One other important duty I had was to help Heidi with the call to move stations. We both had megaphones. But hers had a song, mine only had a siren. (The siren scared the kids!) The song was “Ole, ole, ole, ole”. The kids loved this and were chanting it throughout the day. Might they have been doing that at home too? Hmmmm. So now the final part of the Ollie/Seal-ia saga. Sealia sent Ollie a poem. This was read at the closing assembly. “Coral is red, seashells are blue, Ollie the arctic seal, I have a crush on you.” Both boys and girls loved it and bought into the whole scheme. What will happen next? There might be another segment at Dinner and a Show. After the kids left we were grateful for pizza from Pizza Hut as a celebration. We also spent time debriefing. Everyone left and the quiet settled in. Whew. We had a great Thursday night worship service and then home for leftovers!

One last thing – I won't go into the Saturday and Sunday things, given this is as long as it is already. But on Friday 2 important things happened. We submitted an application for another security grant for 2027, more details to come on that. Also, we submitted our close out reporting for the 2026 grant. I sure was proud of all we accomplished.

Big thanks to Bob Parker and the entire security team for the work that went into these projects.
