Reflections from the Rev.

As you are reading this, we've most likely already said goodbye to 2025 and hello to 2026. In December we reflected on the many things we accomplished in 2025. For our first newsletter of 2026, it seems appropriate to look at what we have set as goals for 2026.

As part of setting goals for the church, I thought it would be helpful for you to know more about the specific tasks of any clergy person appointed to any United Methodist congregation. These tasks are found in our Book of Discipline (affectionately referred to as the BOD). For those new to Methodism, the BOD is basically the rules of our denomination. We could spend a lot of time on the BOD alone, but how about we just focus on ¶340. The title of this section is called "Responsibilities and Duties of Elders and Licensed Pastors".

First, we have "word and ecclesial acts". This is a fancy way of saying that a pastor is expected to preach, counsel, preside over marriages and celebrations of life, and visit the sick. Next, we are responsible for "sacraments" or administering baptisms and the Lord's Supper.

There's also "order". Providing guidance and support to the lay leadership of a church. We also oversee all educational activities to make sure what is taught United Methodist thinking. We are responsible for planning, execution, and evaluation. We are to be on the lookout for others who may be called to ministry. I'm grateful for the pastor that took task seriously with me. Beyond the local church, we are expected to participate as much as possible in annual conference projects, generally projects that would enhance the ministries of their local church.

The final area of responsibility for clergy involves "service." We are asked to embody the teachings of Jesus in servant ministry and leadership. To create environments that inspires the local church to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. To encourage caring and giving ministries that extend to the local community and the world.

With all of that boring stuff behind us, let's look at some of the things that the goals for our St. John's United Methodist church family this year.

First let's look at our goals for worship, teaching, and care.

Build learning programs for all ages.

Build out age specific fellowship groups (i.e. Young Adult, Singles, Youth)

Identify someone to lead a Women's Bible Study

Identify someone to lead a young person's choir

Reboot the puppet ministry

Prospective preaching Themes for 2026

Mix of Lectionary and other sermon series

Increasing care offerings

Visiting Shut-in, Taking communion to those who can't get to church

Now let's look at our goals in the area of order.

Continue with St. Johns Church Council through the book "Canoeing the Mountains". Projected to be finished by end of 2026.

Full implementation of Tithe.ly by mid-2026.

Look for sensible ways to cut expenses without cutting back essential church functions.

Finally let's look at our goals in the area of service.

Explore ways to be visible in the Kingman area in ways not being addressed by other churches.

Greetings from the Parish Nurse



I saw this post and it so precisely describes what I try to teach people that I am sharing it with you all. Hospice is to help and support the patient and their caregiver get through the most difficult time in their lives. There is a lot of teaching involved. Everyone is terrified.

Morphine doesn't kill people. Pain does.

But in hospice, fear often wins.

Families whisper:

"Won't it speed things up?"

"Can't we wait until the very end?"

"I don't want them to sleep through the goodbye."

We get it. You're scared. You love them.

But withholding morphine doesn't preserve life.

It prolongs suffering.

Here's the truth:

- The standard starting dose of liquid morphine (Roxanol) is 5mg—roughly equivalent in effect to one tablet of Norco 5/325 (hydrocodone + acetaminophen).
- Sublingual morphine begins working in 15–30 minutes, peaks at ~1 hour, and lasts 2–4 hours.
- When appropriately dosed and titrated, morphine rarely causes respiratory depression—even in frail, terminal patients. In one study of 27,000, the risk was <0.5%.

What morphine does:

- → Relieves pain
- → Reduces air hunger
- → Calms terminal agitation
- → Lowers cardiac strain
- → Sometimes—Relief allows a person to be more present, just long enough to say what matters most.

Because death is inevitable. But suffering doesn't have to be.

This is what trained hospice teams do:

We don't hasten death.

We relieve suffering—at the most sacred time in someone's life.

All medications must be prescribed and managed by a licensed provider.

For educational purposes only.

Also: a gentle reminder to drink water, wash your hands (with SOAP) and get vaccinated.
